THE WORD *in our* LIVES

BE CAREFUL WHAT YOU ASK FOR!

Jesus talks about praying for whatever we need with faith and confidence, but he ends with the words, "how much more with the Father...give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" (Lk 1:13) Is he saying there are limits to what you can ask for?

There is a saying: "Be careful what you ask for." Just because you want something doesn't mean it will be good for you. But if you have enough faith to pray for something, you probably would not pray for anything evil. So what is Jesus really saying? He is giving us two lessons about prayer.

First, he assures us that God does hear our prayers and answers them. Many people take the idea of "ask and you shall receive" so literally, that they expect God to do their bidding no matter what they want. But God is free to do what is best for us, free to answer some prayers with a "No" when what we seek is against God's will. So maybe our first prayer would be to ask God to show us what we really need.

That leads us to the second lesson: Prayer changes us, not God. If we truly pray for something as Jesus prayed, we would say "not as I will, but as you will." (Mt 26:39) It's not easy to change our minds about what we want or need. To change our desires from selfish to holy takes a lot of power, the Power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus was raised from the dead by that power and we will too. (Rom 8:11) So when Jesus promises that the Father will give the Spirit to us for asking, the Spirit is both the source of and the answer to our prayers. Let us ask the Spirit to empower us to desire and pray for what we really need.

ST. VINCENT de PAUL FUND

Your monthly envelope set periodically includes a St. Vincent de Paul Fund envelope. This fund is used to provide emergency assistance for those inside and outside of our parish community who have need of help in specific areas, e.g. utility bills, prescription drugs, rent, groceries, etc. These requests come to us as referrals from qualified agencies like Catholic Charities and Metro Social Services. Requests for assistance have increased over the years, and our ability to assist has also increased...thanks to the kind generosity of our parishioners. You may find it interesting to know how your money has been of assistance:

- 2005-2006** — \$3,758 collected — 28 recipients assisted (40% increase in donations over previous year)
- 2006-2007** — \$5,904 collected — 39 recipients assisted (57% increase in donations over previous year)
- 2007-2008** — \$5,046 collected — 33 recipients assisted (14% decrease in donations over previous year)
- 2008-2009** — \$7,242 collected — 70 recipients assisted (44% increase in donations over previous year)
- 2009-2010** — \$10,320 collected — 186 recipients assisted (41% increase in donations over previous year)
